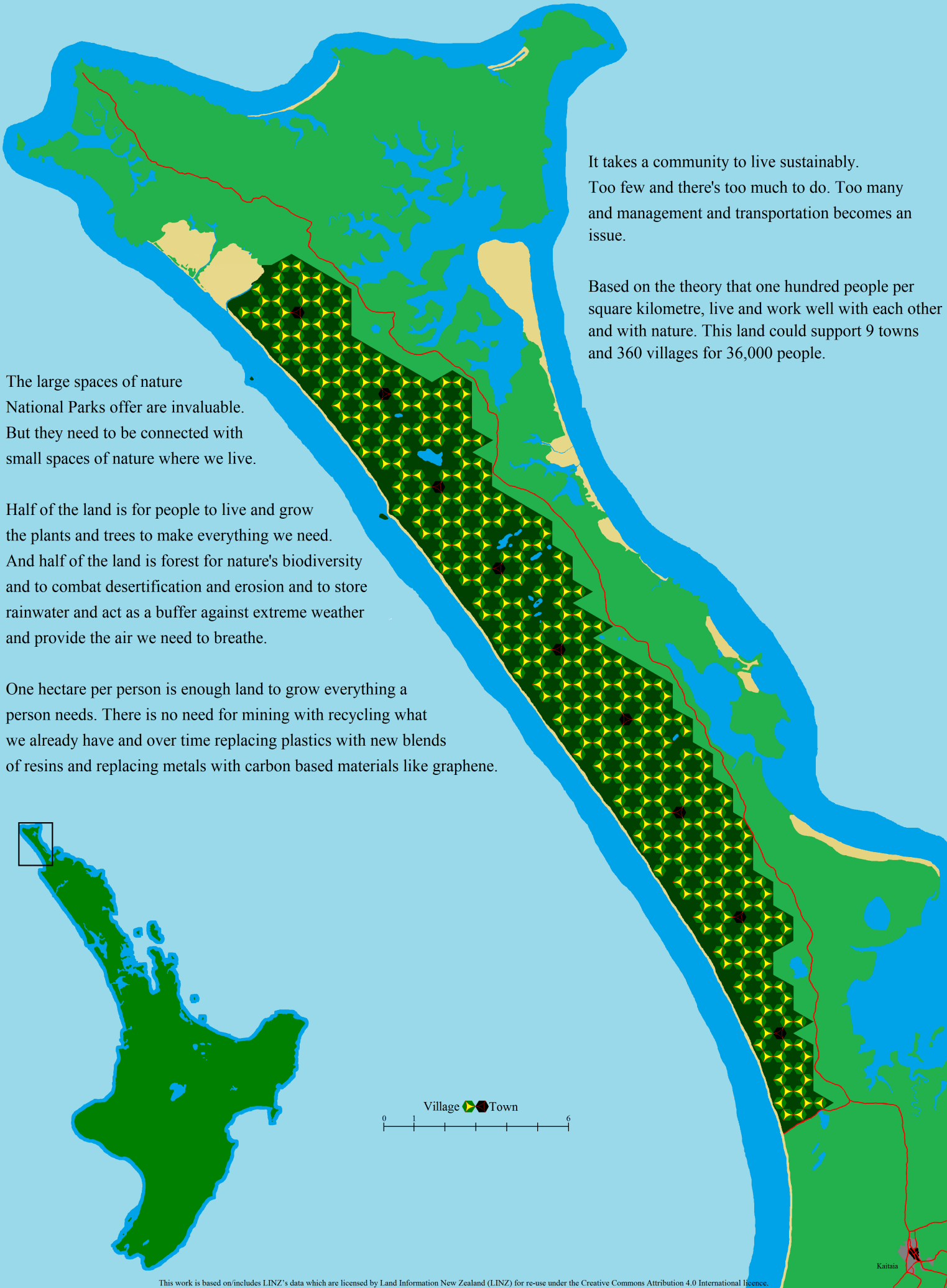


Aupouri Forest Sustainable Community Proposal



It takes a community to live sustainably.
Too few and there's too much to do. Too many
and management and transportation becomes an
issue.

Based on the theory that one hundred people per
square kilometre, live and work well with each other
and with nature. This land could support 9 towns
and 360 villages for 36,000 people.

The large spaces of nature
National Parks offer are invaluable.
But they need to be connected with
small spaces of nature where we live.

Half of the land is for people to live and grow
the plants and trees to make everything we need.
And half of the land is forest for nature's biodiversity
and to combat desertification and erosion and to store
rainwater and act as a buffer against extreme weather
and provide the air we need to breathe.

One hectare per person is enough land to grow everything a
person needs. There is no need for mining with recycling what
we already have and over time replacing plastics with new blends
of resins and replacing metals with carbon based materials like graphene.
